

# Canadian MAiD Curriculum (CMC) Phase 1: Introducing Consistency in MAiD Education

## WHAT IS THE CMC?

In August 2023, CAMAP launched the **CMC**, the first **nationally accredited, bilingual** education program supporting MAiD practice in Canada. This 8-topic, modular course aims to educate new MAiD practitioners, advance the skills of existing MAiD practitioners, while promoting a standardized approach to MAiD care across Canada.

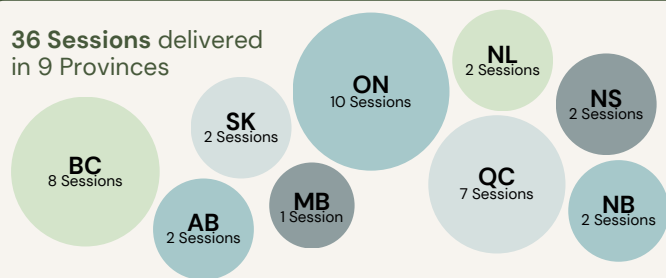

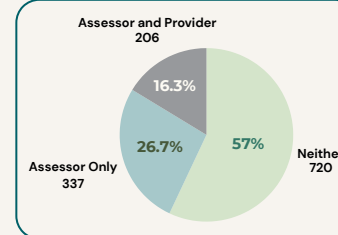

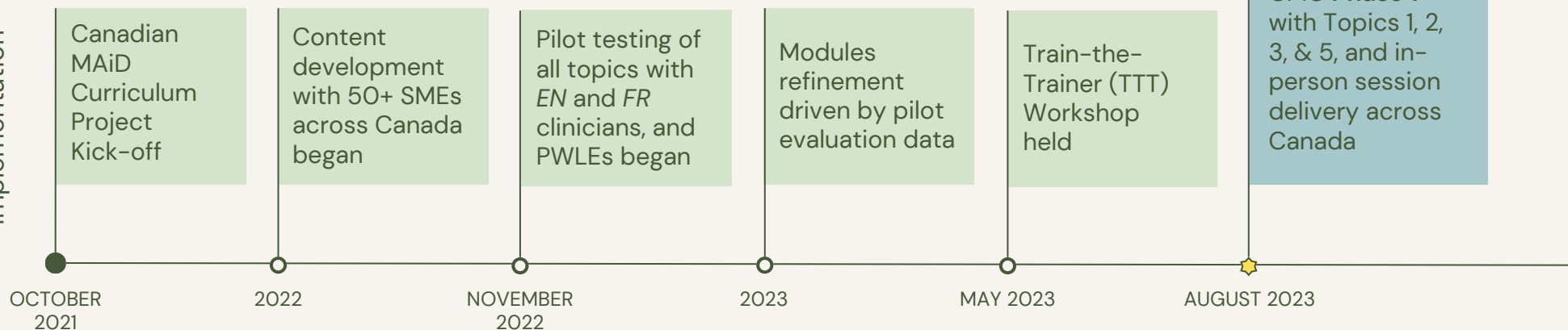

Starting in June 2024, we embrace a majority virtual approach to delivering the curriculum, focusing on **increasing accessibility, flexibility, and inclusivity** for learners across Canada. The curriculum will be delivered in seasonal programs, stratified by Canada's regions, ensuring comprehensive coverage of all learners from coast-to-coast-to-coast.

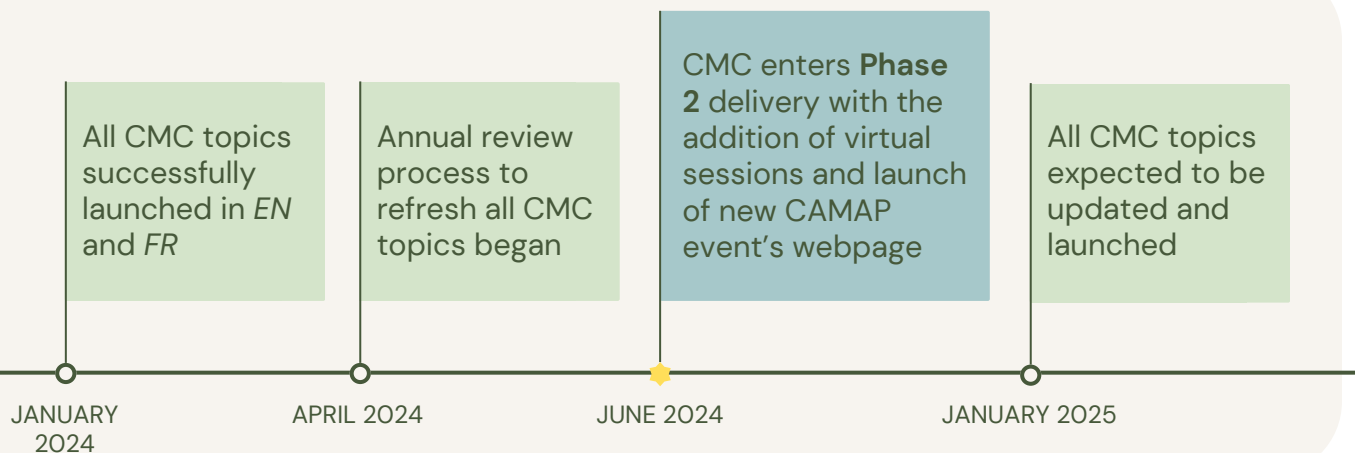

## Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ's)

**How do I register for the Canadian MAiD Curriculum?**

- Scan the QR Code above to register! (MD/NPs only)

**How long will I have access to the curriculum?**

- Clinicians (licensed physicians and nurse practitioners) can enjoy free access to the curriculum during their initial 12 months of enrollment until March 2026.

**How much time is required to complete all topics of the curriculum?**

- The CMC is approximately 13 hours of online self-study and 14 hours of facilitated sessions.

**I am not a clinician, can I register?**

- At this time, the full curriculum is only available to licensed physicians and nurse practitioners. *Topic 1: Foundations of MAiD in Canada* is available to non-clinicians for a cost-recovery fee of \$50.
